The Secrets of The Delta
(2007)

In the Evros Delta there live roughly 25 families of Greek fishermen in wooden huts on stilts in the water. The documentary chronicles the history of a special friendship between a pair of Greek fishermen that lives there and a pair of Turkish fishermen from the side of Ainos. Almost every day they meet along the virtual aquatic borderline and help one another. The camera watches this friendship and also the journey made by the Greeks to Ainos in order to meet their friends on land for the first time. Against the backdrop of this extraordinary friendship, the documentary – which was shot over one year – brings us scenes of ancient Ainos as well as footage of magnificent landscapes and fishing in the Delta, unlocking the secrets of this magical place. From the tiny town of Bra, the Slow Food movement has grown to become a revolution, that now has roots in more than 150 countries. Cheese-makers, vintners, and artisanal food folk, toast Slow Food for bringing about a change in consciousness that shook the very foundation of gastronomy. Salmon Confidential is a new film on the government cover up of what is killing BC's wild salmon. When biologist Alexandra Morton discovers BC's wild salmon are testing positive for dangerous European salmon viruses associated with salmon farming worldwide, a chain of events is set off by government to suppress the findings. Tracking viruses, Morton moves from courtrooms, into British Columbia's most remote rivers, Vancouver grocery stores and sushi restaurants. Fishes of Bosphorus

(2012)

Asking questions behind campaigns such as "Don't Let the Lüfer Go Extinct!", "How many centimeters is yours?", "If there are no small fish, there are no big fish, too" and "We do not eat for a reason", "Fishes of Bosphorus", a documentary film, starts by looking into answers of these questions. Fish are not the only loss, as Karekin Deveciyan's book, *Where did all the fishes go?*, shows us – the bonds of the city and the sea were lost, too. This documentary aims to remind us of the past, while focusing on today's struggle. Featuring many interviews with fishermen, collected memories and photos, the goal of the film is to "remember what we have lost, but this shouldn't make us count on what is left." To paint a robust picture, the filmmakers sought the opinions of authors, academics and NGO's engaged in the matter. From overfishing to pollution and the Bosphorus to global waters, many issues are discussed in "Fishes of Bosphorus" – a documentary reflecting İstanbul's transformation with respect to changes in the sea.
